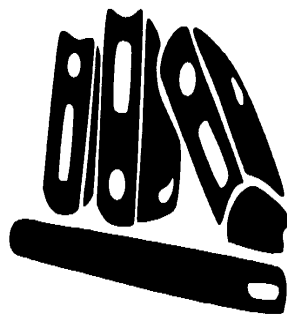

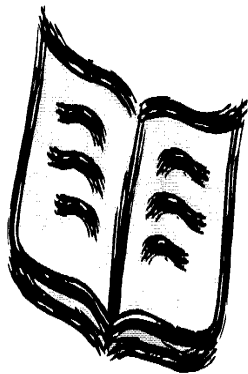


Attleboro Public Schools
